**A spokesperson for the Office for Judicial Complaints said:**

“District Judge Armon-Jones has received a reprimand from the Lord Chief Justice following an investigation into a complaint made by a litigant-in-person. The investigation found, and the Lord Chancellor and the Lord Chief Justice agreed, that the District Judge’s treatment of the complainant at Clerkenwell & Shoreditch County Court on 31 March 2010 was unprofessional and discourteous.”
